A tiny up thrust coral atoll rising to a height of just 60 metres above sea level, Niue is composed entirely of coralline limestone and marble.

The island's most striking feature is its rugged and rocky terrain. Steep cliffs along the coastline are honeycombed by caves, chasms and blowholes.

Niue prides itself on a forest undisturbed for centuries. It is a nature lover's delight.

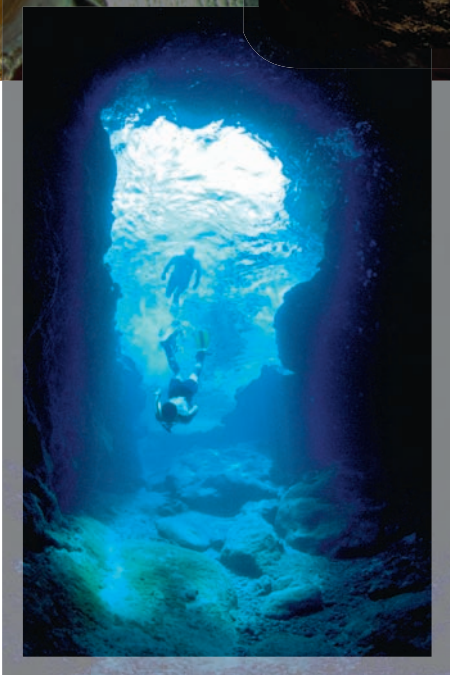
With a population of just 2,500 people on its 258 km<sup>2</sup> of land mass, this is one of the smallest and most delightful island nations in the world.

**Climate:** April to November is the long dry season, with temperature around 24 degrees celsius. December to March,

slightly higher temperatures of 28 degrees celsius. Generally pleasant year-round warm weather.

**Accommodation:** Hotel, Motel and Guesthouse, Budget, Superior, Resort Style and Self-Catering

**Airlines:** Polynesian Blue from Samoa and Auckland.



**Entry requirements:** Valid passport.

**Health:** No vaccinations required, be careful with Coral cuts, take antiseptic cream.
